THE FIFTH YEAR OF THE RECONSTRUCTION PROCESS OF THE MUSEU NACIONAL/UFRJ WAS MARKED BY SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS IN THE RESTORATION OF THE SÃO CRISTÓVÃO PALACE AND IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROJECTS TO ENSURE THAT THE MUSEUM IS RETURNED TO SOCIETY EVEN MORE **ACCESSIBLE, SAFE, DIVERSE AND SUSTAINABLE.**

This commitment of the **Project Museu Nacional Vive** (Museu Nacional Lives) – technical cooperation between the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro (UFRJ), the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) and the Vale Cultural Institute – permeated the work of **more than 200 professionals** who currently collaborate in the areas of architecture, engineering, restoration, preservation, museography, scientific research, archaeology, education, project management, among others.

In April, we completed the **restoration of the facades and roofs of the historic wing** of the palace. One of the milestones of this stage was the restoration of 50% of the roofs of the entire museum, around 1,634m². In the following months, the work progressed to the **side wings**, resulting in consolidated masonry, recomposed friezes and historic elements, new concrete slabs and platbands.

The **expansion of dialogue** with institutions such as the Ministries of Education, Culture and the *Instituto do Patrimônio Histórico e Artístico Nacional* [Institute of National Historical and Artistic Heritage] (Iphan) is another 2023 milestone. A symbol of this closer involvement was the incorporation of Iphan's guidelines into the architectural and restoration project for the São Cristóvão palace, contributing to the **approval of the architectural interventions presented for wings 1 and 3** of the monument.

Children, young people and adults also accompanied the reconstruction of the Museum more closely throughout the year, responding to our invitation to take part in **educational and cultural events at Quinta da Boa Vista park**, such as the *Museu Nacional Vive* Festival, held in partnership with the various sectors of the institution.

In addition to new cultural and educational activities, 2024 will see an intense schedule of works. A new stage will begin, including services such as the restoration of the facades and roofs of wings 2 and 3, the restoration of floors, paintings and ornaments of the **Bendegó meteorite room**; the restoration of the **monumental staircase** and the installation of a skylight over the courtyard. With this, **we hope to enable**, as of next September – and for the first time after the fire – public access to these two iconic sectors of the Museum.



CONSTRUCTION AND SERVICES

The restoration of the facades and roofs of the **São Cristóvão Palace**, headquarters of the **Museu Nacional/ UFRJ**, began in 2021, after several emergency actions: the installation of a temporary roof, the recovery of collections inside the palace and the protection of historical and artistic elements that survived the fire.

In September 2022, the front facade of the palace was open to society, along with part of the first wing roofs and all restored marble sculptures.





We come to the end of 2023 celebrating developments such as:

- → Restoration of all facades (front and side) of wing 1;
- → Recovery of the entire set of hardware and rails from wing 1;
- → Restoration of all the window frames (front and sides) in accordance with the original references;

- → 50% of the palace roofs are done;
- → Installation of new steel structure roofs in wing 1;
- → Installation of new concrete slabs in wing 1; waterproofing of corrugated concrete slab and solid concrete slab in wing 2;
- → Reconstruction and repainting of historic friezes and elements;
- → Consolidation of masonry (wings 1, 2 and 3);



- → Construction of new cymatia and platbands in wing 2, including friezes, waterproofing and rounded edges;
- → Structural reinforcement of spans with metal system in wing 1;
- → Restoration of centennial
 Carrara marble sculptures;
- → Production and installation of replicas of the sculptures in the crowning of the palace.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL MONITORING, PROSPECTING AND RESCUE

Monitoring, prospecting and rescue activities at the historic site saw progress in 2023, with the identification of new archaeological evidence associated with the palace's former occupants and workers.

New archaeological structures were found, revealing transformations that the building has undergone over time. In a new area of archaeological deposits, several artifacts have been recovered and are being analyzed by experts.

ARCHAEOLOGY AND THE NEW EXHIBITIONS

Together with the architectural and curatorial teams for the new exhibitions, the professionals are planning on how to display artifacts and archaeological testimonies to the Museum's future visitors. The **semi-circular end (apse) of a chapel** that once existed in wing 4, a rather unique floor found in wing 2, a **foundation carved out of rock** and a **spout** in wing 1 are some of the evidence that has already been incorporated into the architectural plans and future exhibitions.

The display of these finds suggests a more comprehensive and inclusive narrative, expanding knowledge about the uses and transformations of the building, and about the work of the free and enslaved people who served there.

ARCHITECTURE AND RESTORATION

In June, Iphan's Office in Rio de Janeiro approved the **Restoration and Architecture Preliminary Project** for the São Cristóvão Palace and the annex building Alípio de Miranda Ribeiro.

The **executive project** was presented in August, in compliance with international guidelines on **universal accessibility**, **heritage preservation**, **safety**, **sustainability** and suggesting that the Museum be even more **connected with the gardens of Quinta da Boa Vista**. The incorporation of **archaeological finds**, the restoration of historical elements, the revitalization of **iconic spaces** and the **annex building** were also included.

In November, **Iphan approved the architectural interventions proposed for wings 1 and 3 of the palace**, making it possible for a new stage of works to



The architecture and restoration project of the Palace is also already under analysis by the Municipal Department of People with Disabilities of Rio de Janeiro. Any suggestions from experts will be incorporated into the original proposal. "The president of Iphan, Leandro Grass, was at the São Cristóvão Palace in February and made a commitment to join the Institutional Committee of the Project Museu Nacional Vive. Since then, we have been following the development of all stages of the architecture and recovery project. Our multidisciplinary team has participated in weekly meetings and technical visits, discussing all the details of the project. This is the most important external restoration initiative for Iphan in Brazil at the moment. That is why, in 2024, we will continue to work together, supporting and prioritizing actions to deliver, in 2026, the first wing of the restored Palace and with attractive and inspiring exhibitions."

RED MARKINGS INDICATE THE LOCATION OF NEW ITEMS THAT HAVE BEEN ADDED TO THE FIRE PROTECTION SYSTEM The development of complementary projects to the architecture of São Cristóvão Palace, such as acoustics, **air conditioning and sustainability,** also evolved in 2023.

One of the biggest developments is the **fire prevention and fire fighting system**, which has already been approved by the **Rio de Janeiro State Fire Brigade.**

In addition, as a result of a consultancy carried out in the area of risk management, new protections have been included in the system. The objective was to reinforce **horizontal compartmentalization**, to prevent fire from spreading to other sectors of the same floor.

New solutions incorporated:

- → **Fire doors** in the passageways between the palace wings;
- → Closure with fire-resistant plasterboard in windows close to each other;
- → **Fire dampers** in air conditioning ducts;
- \rightarrow Redistribution of fire hydrants.



In 2023, the Museum and the Project Museu Nacional Vive teams continued to work in an integrated manner, building the future longterm exhibition circuits. In the first half of the year, the document that integrated the expository narrative with the existing space was delivered.

From there, the Museography, Visual Communication and Universal Accessibility Project began to be developed. The important preliminary study stage has been completed, covering activities in the following disciplines:

Museography: Organization of the contents and exhibition experiences in the different areas of the palace; integration and compatibility of the museographic proposal with the architecture and complementary projects.

Visual Communication: Audience analysis and strategies; development of visual identity and visual concept guidelines for long-term exhibitions.

Universal Accessibility: Development of an integrated accessibility conceptual proposal.

Conservation and Museology: Survey and analysis of the types of collections on display; definition of technical guidelines for the exhibition of the collection to ensure its safety and integrity.





The implementation of a research and education campus for the academic community was an old plan of the Museu Nacional/UFRJ that is becoming a reality.

In 2023, the 43,400 m²²piece of land next to Quinta da Boa Vista, which already housed the **administrative module** and the **Central Conservation and Restoration Laboratory**, also had a modular unit to receive visits from schools, the **Museu Nacional Station**, which will be inaugurated in 2024.


More developments:

- → Civil construction of the emergency laboratory modules in final stage;
- → Infrastructure construction in final stage;
- → Start of the construction of the laboratory for handling liquid-based collections.



CENTRAL LIBRARY





Located in Quinta da Boa Vista's Botanical Garden, the Central Library of the Museu Nacional/UFRJ houses more than 500 thousand volumes, including rare publications that once belonged to Brazil's Imperial family.

With funds from the Project Museu Nacional Vive, the unit underwent the largest renovation and expansion work in its history, completed in 2022. The unit gained **another 1,200 m² of floor area**, an **auditorium** with 120 seats, **new rooms** for classes, reading and storage of publications, **offices** for teachers, an **audiovisual room** and a **restoration and conservation laboratory**. A modern **fire prevention and firefighting system** has been installed.

The entire Library will be delivered to the academic community in 2024, after the installation of new **elevators** and the air **conditioning system**, which is underway.

"All over the world, libraries have been transformed into cozier and more attractive spaces. We will have a renewed physical structure and greater capacity to manage bibliographic collections, valuing the professionals who work in the sector. When we reopen to the public, we will resume the mission of supporting teaching, research and extension at the Museu Nacional, contributing to the production of knowledge at UFRJ. We will also reinforce the social role and cultural equipment of the Library, making its structure available to the surrounding communities."

Inaugurated in September 2022, the exhibitions "Museu Nacional Vive" and "Recompõe.Mineralogia" remained open to the public at Quinta da Boa Vista until March 2023. In partnership with the Teaching Assistance Section of the Museu Nacional/UFRJ, several educational actions were carried out, with the participation of approximately **5,000 people during the first three months of the year.**

DIALOGUE WITH INSTITUTIONS

In 2023, the Project expanded institutional relationship strategies and opened the doors of São Cristóvão Palace to receive authorities, partners, neighbors of the Museum and international experts in the area of heritage.

"It is important for the country to rebuild its first museum, which has existed since 1818 and is listed by Iphan. We are standing before the oldest research and education institution in the field of natural and anthropological sciences in Brazil. 

EDUCATING CITY



The Project Museu Nacional Vive and the Museu Nacional/UFRJ are creating the Educating City Program. The formation of an educational network between schools and museums progressed in 2023, through meetings with primary school teachers and specialists.

Teaching material was developed based on content related to the Museum's future exhibitions. In 2024, a pilot program will be implemented in 7 schools in Rio de Janeiro, with support from the Rio de Janeiro Municipal Department of Education.




Started in 2021, the campaign to restore the collections of the Museu Nacional/ UFRJ has the support of institutional partners, private collectors, museums in Brazil and abroad.

This great mobilization has so far resulted in the donation of thousands of pieces, 1,701 of which have already been incorporated into future exhibitions. Minerals, taxidermized animals, fossils and archaeological materials are among the pieces received. Other offers are under curatorial analysis.

Leaders of African and indigenous cultures have also dialogued with the Museum and contributed to the formation of diverse and multicultural collections. Some of the donations received in 2023:

→ Replica of a Coelacanth fish, an endangered species. The replica donated by the Muséum national d'Historie naturelle is 130 centimeters long, weighs about 3 kilos and replaces the copy that the Museum lost in the 2018 fire. The current piece was painted by visual artist Louis de Torhout and was created from another plaster replica scanned by 3D Solutions;



- → Engraving of Empress Leopoldina, donated by Frances Reynolds;
- → Small **Egyptian statue** (Late Period faience Ushabti), donated by Edilson Lopes;
- → 1,042 specimens of **moths and butterflies** (lepidoptera), most of which originated in the Atlantic Forest, donated by Ivan Pinto;
- → 531 objects (feathers, utensils, weapons, body adornments, basketry and ceramics) of indigenous ethnic groups: Bororo, Xavante, Rikbaktsa, Parecis, Enawenê Nawê, Kalapalo, Waurá, peoples of the Upper Rio Negro and Yanomami. Donation from Aivone Carvalho;
- → 2 minerals from Russia: Uvarovite and Charoite, donated by the Russian Embassy in Brazil;
- → 11 complete skeletons and 2 skulls of **marine animals**, donated by Aquasis Ceará;
- → 8 ceramic pieces donated by the Turuza Waurá people of Batovi village (Xingu indigenous territory in the state of Mato Grosso);
- → Turma da Mônica comic book signed by Mauricio de Souza, published shortly after the fire at the Museum.

THE FESTIVAL'S AUDIENCE OCCUPIED ALAMEDA DAS SAPUCAIAS, IN QUINTA DA BOA VISTA

On September 03, a free event was held to celebrate the fifth anniversary of the reconstruction of the Museu Nacional/UFRJ. The *Museu Nacional Vive Festival* attracted about **6,000 people** to Quinta da Boa Vista, offering 30 educational and scientific dissemination actions, cultural presentations, conversation circles and a gastronomic fair. "I came here to introduce my people, the Karajá people, who made a donation to the Museum. We saw the fire that burned this wonderful museum. It can't fade away, it has to rise again! This museum is very important for all of us Brazilians, for other countries as well."






GOVERNANCE

Institutional Committee

Consultative in nature with the participation of partners from the public, private and governmental spheres, this committee aims to ensure permanent and transparent communication with society.
